

Constitution

1. Purpose

Horse Welfare Incorporated was formed to support neglected horses in need.

2. Objectives

Whenever and wherever possible:

- Rescue, Rehabilitate, Re-educate and Re-House Equines in need.
- Educate the general public and horse owners in appropriate nutrition and health care of horses
- Raise the awareness of Horses in need in our community and the legal obligations of owners/carers.
- To provide emergency care, treatment and assistance to horses.
- To contribute to the development of improved government legislation and policy.
- Engage and liaise with other relevant welfare groups to improve horse welfare

3. Non-profit clause

Horse Welfare Incorporated is a not for profit charity. The assets and income of the association shall be applied solely in furtherance of its above mentioned objects and no portion shall be distributed directly or indirectly to the members of the organisation except as bona fide compensation for services rendered or expenses incurred on behalf of the organisation.

4. Dissolution clause

If the organisation is wound up or if the endorsement of the organisation as a deductible gift recipient is revoked, the following assets remaining after the payment of the organisation's debts and liabilities shall be transferred to a fund, authority or institution to which income tax deductible gifts can be made, and, who exists for a similar purpose:

- Gifts of money or property for the principal purpose of the organisation
- Contributions made in relation to an eligible fundraising event held for the principal purpose of the organisation, and
- Money received by the organisation because of such gifts and contributions.



5. Rules of the Organisation

Horse Welfare Incorporated has adopted the Model Rules for Incorporated associations under the Associations Incorporation Act 1984.
